Dr. Wood is a leading scholar in cartographic design, the experience of place, and the relation between art and geography. His books include *The Power of Maps* (1992/2010), *Seeing Through Maps: The Power of Images to Shape our World View* (2001/2006), *Five Billion Years of Global Change: A History of the Land* (2004), *Making Maps: A Visual Guide to Map Design for GIS* (2005), and *The Natures of Maps: Cartographic Constructions of the Natural World* (2009).

This colloquium will discuss the links between the situationist movement of Guy Debord and the works of urban planner Kevin Lynch which have had a major impact on behavioral geography, urban geography, and time geography, as well as urban sociology, planning, and architecture.
